### CAMP-OUT:

- Set up a tent or put down a tarp for a dry sleeping place
- Lay down a sleeping bag to get cozy
- Use hammocks or Enos for sleeping

## CAMP-IN:

- Make a blanket fort
- Hang up twinkle lights or light candles
- Put down some blankets, padding, etc. for comfortable sleeping

## ACTIVITY IDEAS

Most of these ideas can be adapted for inside or outside camping, so choose a few for your family overnight:

- Start a **CAMPFIRE** outside or use candles inside your house
- Make SHADOW PUPPETS on a wall or on the side of your tent
- Try a flashlight **SCAVENGER HUNT**
- Use your flashlight as the LIMBO pole and get low
- FLASHLIGHT TAG: the best!
- Listen for **NATURE SOUNDS** or open your windows to hear them; you can even play nature sounds if you live in the city
- LOOK AT THE STARS check out our suggestions on our Stargazing info page!
- Pull out some **GLOW STICKS** for lots of fun; stick them in clear empty plastic bottles to make a glow bowling set
- Pull out the **SPARKLERS**, and try taking some cool pictures
- CATCH FIREFLIES!
- Have a flashlight DANCE PARTY
- Play FUN GAMES: Uno or Go Fish

# MEAL IDEAS

#### **DINNER:**

**TACO IN A BAG**: keep it simple by making this classic Greystone meal. Take individual Fritos bags and fill with your favorite taco toppings. Give it a good shake and eat with a fork. You can cook the meat over the fire or reheat in foil near the fire.

**WEINER DOG SOCIAL:** roast a hot dog over the fire and try a combo of some of these camp-favorite toppings: ketchup, mustard, diced onions, relish, cheddar cheese, guacamole, salsa, black beans, sauerkraut, baked beans, bacon, or ranch.

FOIL PACKET MEALS: mix and match your favorite foods and heat them in foil over the fire. Check out some fun recipes online.

### S'MORES:

Try a classic s'mores or one of these great variations:

- INSTEAD OF THE GRAHAM CRACKER: fudge striped cookies, sugar cookies, flavored graham crackers, rice krispie treats, Oreos
- INSTEAD OF THE CHOCOLATE: candy bar, peanut butter cup, melted caramel, chocolate covered pretzels
- ADDITIONS TO THE S'MORE: bananas, peanut butter, jelly, candied bacon, coconut, nutella

#### BREAKFAST:

**BREAKFAST BURRITOS**: make everyone happy with this make-your-own breakfast idea that you can make ahead of time and reheat over a fire or in your microwave. Throw in a mix of potatoes, meat, eggs, cheese, and even onions or peppers. Wrap and heat!

## VIEW THE STARS

- To get started, **TURN OFF ALL THE LIGHTS** in your area. House lights, outside lights, and more. The very best place to view stars would be about 30 minutes outside of a city, but your backyard can work!
- Try using a **STAR FINDING APP**. Some great choices are <u>SkyView</u> <u>Lite</u> or <u>Stellarium Plus</u>.
- If you want to stay unplugged, try <u>printing out this image</u> of the **STARS YOU CAN SEE IN THE SKY** during this time of year.

# TAKE IT TO THE NEXT LEVEL

### **READ A BOOK:**

If you're interested in finding out more about the stars, check out one of these cool books:

- GLOW IN THE DARK CONSTELLATIONS: The constellations on the pages actually glow in this cool book!
