
Camp Leaders



Music at Greystone



Suggestions for Campers

Baggage. No luggage larger than a steamer trunk should be brought to camp. Trunk and duffle bag should be checked or expressed to Tuxedo, N. C., several days before camp opens. A charge of 50 cents each way will be made for baggage transfer from Tuxedo. If trunk has spring lock it is wise to bring two keys, one of which should be deposited at the office. A list of all articles brought to camp should be pasted in the top of the trunk.

No valuable jewelry should be brought to camp.

Tickets. Buy tickets to Tuxedo, N. C., which is on the main line of the Southern Railway between Asheville and Spartanburg. Pullman service enables girls to come to Camp Greystone with ease from every part of the country.

Representatives of Camp Greystone will meet all trains at Tuxedo, N. C., on opening day. Those arriving any other date should notify the director.

Full particulars concerning schedules and meeting places of counselors and campers will be sent to all who enroll.

Highways. U. S. Highway No. 25, from Asheville, N. C., to Greenville, S. C., passes near Camp Greystone. Watch for the Greystone sign just south of Tuxedo.

Mail, Express and Freight should be sent to Tuxedo, N. C. Telegrams and Long Distance Telephone Calls are through Hendersonville, N. C. Girls should not be called over telephone except in emergencies.
