

STAFF PACKING LIST



TOPS

- Short sleeved t-shirts (10-12 day supply)
- Long sleeved t-shirts
- Sweatshirt(s)
- Lightweight jacket or fleece
- Plain white shirts (for “Whites” at camp)
- Cute shirts (polo/nicer shirts for guys)

BOTTOMS

- Sports shorts (10-12 day supply)
- Sweatpants or leggings
- Cute shorts/pants (khaki shorts for guys)
- Plain white shorts (for “Whites” at camp)

SHOES

- Water shoes (Chacos, Keens, etc.)
- Tennis shoes/running shoes (1-2 pairs)
- Rain boots
- Sandals

MISCELLANEOUS

- One-piece swimsuits (no tankinis)
- Underwear and socks (10-12 day supply)
- Pajamas
- Rain jacket
- Church clothes (simple dresses/skirts with simple shoes for girls; khakis and collared shirt for men)

COSTUMES (OPTIONAL)

- 4th of July (Main only) - red, white, and blue clothes, accessories, and costumes
- Challenge Day (all sessions) - green and gold clothes, accessories, and costumes
- Corn Roast (Main only) - overalls, plaid, boots
- Animal/wolf shirts for Wildlife Wednesday
- Any fun and crazy costumes you have!

**WE DO NOT RECOMMEND BRINGING
FANCY WORKOUT CLOTHES OR NICE BRANDS.**

BEDDING

- Sleeping bag (for Orientation; optional)
- Pillow and pillowcases
- Mattress pad and egg crate (optional)
- Sheets and bedspread (regular-sized twin beds)

FOR THE CABIN

- Stationery and stamps (in a Ziploc)
- Alarm clock
- Personal fan
- Flashlight or headlamp
- Bible/journal/devotional book
- Laundry bag
- Pictures to hang in your cabin
- Stackable plastic drawers (optional)
- Guitar or other instrument (optional)

BATHROOM

- Toiletries
- Plastic cup
- Shower caddy
- Bath towels, hand towels, and washcloths
- Beach towels
- Towel wrap or robe
- Inexpensive bathroom rug (optional)

FOR AROUND CAMP

- Sunglasses
- Sports-style watch (not a smart watch)
- Sunscreen
- Bug spray
- Water bottle
- Backpack
- Ball cap
- Crazy Creek or camping chair (optional)
- Travel coffee mug (optional)
- Program related items (tennis racket, tap shoes, softball glove, etc) - optional

HELPFUL HINTS

WHAT FORMER COUNSELORS SAY ABOUT HOW TO PACK:

- “A small set of plastic drawers are so nice to have to keep random things, and you can use them as a bedside table!”
- “Don’t pack in your trunk! It can make moving between cabins during the summer hard because they’re so heavy. Duffels or plastic tubs are the way to go!”
- “Pack your envelopes and stationery in a big Ziploc bag. I’ve forgotten before and had all my envelopes sealed shut from the humidity before I could send any letters!”
- “Pack and look at all your clothes. Now cut what you packed in half. Look through what you have and take a third away. Now you’re ready for camp!”



WHAT COUNSELORS SUGGEST YOU SHOULD HAVE:

- “I would definitely recommend a good mattress pad.”
- “You can never have too many pairs of socks!”
- “Bring an extra pair of tennis shoes for rainy or messy EPs!”
- “You’ll be glad you have random things like scissors, tacks, tape, and a black Sharpie. You’ll use them in your cabin more than you would expect.”
- “Last year was my first year and I wish I would’ve packed more books.”
- “An alarm clock...much needed.”
- “My headlamp = my BFF. You’ll use it more frequently than you’d imagine.”
- “If you’re teaching a water activity, I would bring a few extra towels so you’ll always have a dry one.”
- “Mountain weather changes quickly and often - be sure to pack a rain jacket and shoes to wear when it rains (whether rain boots or an old pair of shoes). You’ll also want to bring a comfy sweatshirt or long sleeved shirt. Mornings can be chilly!”
- “On Sundays at camp, we wear whites. Nothing fancy, just a white shirt and white shorts. I’d recommend bringing multiple pairs and a pair of white athletic shorts like Nike shorts or something similar.”
- “Bring fun and crazy costumes - the weirder the better!”

CAMP DRESS CODE:

- All shorts need to have a recognizable inseam.
- Only wear pajamas inside your cabin.
- Midriffs must be covered. All low-cut tank tops need to be worn with a more modest tank top underneath.
- One-piece swimsuits only, please (no tankinis)!
- Guys are required to wear a shirt at all times, unless teaching in a water activity.
- Pack clothes that can get messy/dirty, that can be washed simply, and that are suited for an active camp lifestyle!
