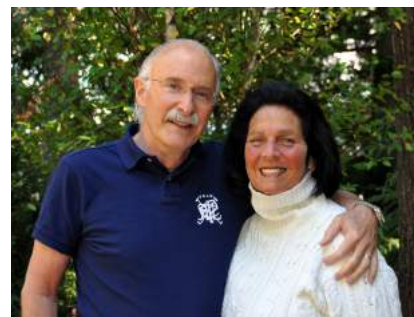

P.S. The major renovation of four of our all-weather tennis courts began shortly after camp ended. Similar to what was done with our basketball courts just prior to our 2016 season, the many top coats were removed. With a combination of grinding plus crack repair and extensive leveling where necessary and the use of a heavy-duty resurfacer with extra course sand, the playing surfaces will be more level and less slippery. These courts will receive two coats of paint in the spring along with painted pickleball lines on at least three of our seven all-weather courts.
