CampInTouch - Parent Portal

CampInTouch is an online hub where parents can access everything they need to stay connected and prepared for camp, via their computer or tablet.

How to Access CampInTouch

- Log in through the Circle F website at “My CFDR.”
- The email address you used to register your child for camp is the same email address you will use to log in.
- Use the same account each year—your information will be saved.
- If you need help resetting a password or accessing your account, contact our office.

Using the Campanian App

CampInTouch has a mobile app called **Campanian**, which makes staying connected even easier. With the app, you can:

- Get push notifications when new camp photos of your camper are posted.
- Upload camper forms directly from your mobile device.
- Log in to check updates on the go.

We recommend downloading the **Campanian app** before camp begins for the easiest access to CampInTouch features.

Camper Forms

Our staff and counselors are dedicated to making every camper feel special by providing personalized attention. These forms are essential for your child’s care at camp to provide important information to our staff and counselors, ensuring we can create the best possible experience for your child.

Deadline for Forms

All forms must be submitted **at least two weeks prior** to the beginning of your camper’s session. Please contact the office if you have any questions.

Instructions for Forms

Forms can be completed through the Campanian app or on your computer or tablet via the CampInTouch Parent Portal. Please complete all sections thoroughly. Even if your child is a returning camper, please update any changes from the past year, as this information is vital to your child’s health and well-being.

Camper Program Release

The State of Florida requires all parents/legal guardians to review and sign this document.

Authorized Grown-Ups

Required to release your child to someone other than his/her parent/legal guardian during or at the end of a camp session.

Counselor Snapshot

This form provides key information that we share with your child's counselors to help them best support and care for your camper. Some details may overlap with the Health History. For legal reasons, the Health History form is not shared with the counselors.

Camper Code of Conduct

Please review with your child the expectations of campers while at camp. The Code of Conduct contains important rules, and details situations in which your child may be expelled from camp. The Camper Code of Conduct can be found at the end of this Handbook.

Camper Photo

Please upload a recent photo of your child to help us recognize him/her on the first day of camp. For returning campers, please update your child's photo each year.

Medical Forms, Care, and Policies

At Circle F Dude Ranch Camp, the health and safety of every camper is our top priority. Our onsite Health Center is staffed by licensed medical professionals, including a Registered Nurse and a Licensed Practical Nurse. We are proud to partner with Camp Medical Services, providing our team with 24/7 access to a licensed physician. While the physician is not physically onsite, they are always available to consult with our medical staff, prescribe medications when appropriate, and guide care decisions to ensure the highest level of support for our campers.

Required Medical Forms

All required medical forms must be completed and submitted **at least two weeks** prior to the beginning of your camper's session, including:

- A digital **Health History**, accessible in your CampInTouch Parent Portal.
- A current **Circle F Camp Physical**, completed and signed by a licensed medical provider.
- Updated **Immunization Record** or exemption certificate.

Your child cannot attend camp without the required medical forms being completed and submitted by the deadline.

Digital Health History

Please complete the detailed Health History for your child. This document includes a medical waiver and release to treat your child and helps our health care team provide the best possible care. You can update this information at any time through your CampInTouch Parent Portal.

Camper Medical Physical

Campers are required to undergo a physical exam by a licensed medical professional within 12 months of the start of their camp session.

If your child has met this requirement, please upload a copy of the form. In most cases, if your child has already undergone a physical exam within the designated time period, their licensed medical professional will not need to see your child in person to complete the form.

If your child has not had a physical exam within the 12 months prior to the start of their camp session, please download this form from your CampInTouch portal registration summary screen, and have your child's licensed medical professional review and complete the form in full. Before uploading this form to your CampInTouch portal, please be sure that the licensed medical professional has placed their office stamp on the form, and the form has been fully completed.

Immunization

We require a copy of your child's immunization history or an exemption certificate. You may submit this by uploading it, emailing it, or mailing it to us.

Medication at Camp

General Policy

All medications (prescription and over the counter) must be checked in with our camp nurse upon arrival at camp. Medications should **not** be kept in cabins unless approved by our health care team.

All medications must be:

- Properly packaged in blister packs via self or pharmacy packing.
- Clearly labeled with the camper's first and last name.
- Accompanied by clear and concise dosage instructions, including the time of day the medication should be taken.
- The information listed on your child's prescription bottle (dosage, medication name, prescribing doctor, etc.)

Prescription Medications

Prescription medications will be administered by the health care staff according to the prescribing provider's instructions.

All prescription medications should be documented in your child's digital Health History form with medication name, dosage, time of administration, and reason for medication.

Over the Counter (OTC) Medications

We stock a variety of common over the counter medications, such as non-narcotic pain relievers, antihistamine medications, and basic first aid treatments. We do not stock vitamins or daily use allergy medications such as Zyrtec and Claritin.

With your consent provided in the digital Health History, our nursing team—working in consultation with our camp physician—may administer OTC medications as needed.

OTC medications and/or vitamins that are taken daily should be noted in your child's digital Health History with the medication name, dosage, time of administration, and reason for medication. To ensure proper administration, OTC medications and vitamins must be brought to camp in blister packaging and checked in with our camp nurse by the parent/guardian upon arrival at camp.

Medication Packaging Prior to Camp

To ensure safe and efficient medication administration, we require that all camper medications be pre-packaged by using one of the three methods described below. Medications must be fully and properly packaged prior to your child's arrival at camp. Improperly packaged medications will delay camper check-in. We offer families three options for preparing camper medications for use while at camp.

Option 1: CampMeds (Preferred Option)

Families may choose to use **CampMeds**, a medication packaging service. CampMeds prepares all medications in sorted, clearly labeled dose packets and ships them directly to us prior to your child's arrival at camp. This is the most efficient option and helps expedite check-in while reducing the risk of errors.

Setting Up CampMeds

- Create your account at: <https://www.campmeds.com/>
- **CampMeds is UNABLE to fill prescriptions for EPI-Pens and Auvi-Qs.** Families may bring their prescription supplies for these two items from home.
- CampMeds can answer questions about working with insurance companies and processing prescriptions—please contact them directly.

Filling CampMeds Prescription Medications

Plan ahead! You have up to 30 days before the start of camp to submit your child's prescriptions to CampMeds. If your child's medications change before camp begins, contact CampMeds—they can update up to 15 days before the start of camp. Please visit CampMeds' website for the most current information, as their policy may have changed since the time of this writing.

Option 2: Pharmacy Prepared Blister Packs

Families may use their own pharmacy to prepare medications in **blister packs** (also called dose packaging). Blister packs must:

- Be prepared by a licensed pharmacy.
- Include the camper's first and last name.
- Clearly list each medication and dosage.
- Be organized by date and time.

Option 3: Self Packaged Blister Packs

If you package your child's medications yourself, we require:

Color coded blister packs to ensure safe and accurate medication administration. See below for more information on color coding.

All prescription medications **must** be brought with their original pharmacy containers at check-in. Original bottles must:

- Match the medications in the blister packs.
- Include the camper's first and last name.
- Clearly display the name of the prescribed medication.
- Clearly display dosage and prescribing instructions.

This allows our medical team to verify all medications for accuracy and safety. Once verified, our medical team will return all original medication containers to you.

Approved Blister Packs

Search online for: *Medi-Aid Cold Seal Color Coded Blister Card Package*. You can purchase color coded blister packs from several different retailers. If you have questions, or have trouble finding blister packs online, please contact us.

Color Coding Requirements

The color coding system is essential for our Health Center team to quickly identify when medications should be administered. Please organize all medications using the following color system on the blister pack card:

- Orange: Breakfast/Morning
- Green: Lunch/Noon
- Yellow: Dinner/Early Evening
- Blue: Bedtime/Late Evening
- Red: All other times/Other

Labeling Requirements

Each blister pack must be clearly labeled with:

- Camper's first and last name.
- The time of day the medication should be administered.
- The information listed on your child's prescription bottle (dosage, medication name, prescribing doctor, etc.)

For campers attending multiple sessions, make sure to pack enough doses for their entire stay.

Please ensure that each packaged dose matches exactly what is listed in your child's digital Health History form. If there are any discrepancies, we will not be able to administer the medication to your child until we speak with you.

Medication Administration

All medications are administered by our licensed medical staff in the Health Center, unless otherwise approved (e.g., emergency inhalers or EpiPens). Medication administration is based upon physician guidance, nursing judgment, and/or parent/guardian authorization through the digital Health History.

If a camper requires daily medication, it will be scheduled and administered at designated times throughout the day based on the information provided in your child's digital Health History form.

Due to our partnership with Camp Medical Services, Circle F Dude Ranch Camp no longer uses “Standing Orders” for medication administration.

Medical Care at Camp

If a camper becomes ill or injured:

- They will be evaluated by our on-site medical staff.
- Our team will consult with the camp physician as needed.
- Parents/guardians will be contacted.

If a higher level of care is required, we will coordinate with local medical providers and notify parents/guardians promptly.

Our Health Center is staffed from **June 7, 2026 through August 1, 2026**. Communication regarding camper medications or medical needs should be directed to the **Main Office** outside of these dates.

During the camp season, our nursing staff will be assisting campers outside of the Health Center—including during mealtimes and at various times throughout the day. As a result, they may not always be available to answer or return phone calls immediately.

For urgent or time-sensitive matters, please contact the Main Office so we can ensure your message is relayed promptly to our Health Center team.

Specific Medical Needs

If your camper has specific medical needs (e.g., severe allergies, chronic conditions, or specialized care), please contact our team at least two weeks prior to your child’s arrival at camp so we can ensure proper planning and support.

Arrival and Departure

We're excited to have your child join us for a fun filled experience. To ensure a smooth arrival and departure process, please note the following protocol.

Opening Day

Prior to your child's arrival at camp, you will receive an email specifying the designated drop off time for Opening Day. It is essential that all required **forms and documents are completed and uploaded** beforehand to streamline the check in process.

The first drop off block begins at 8:30 a.m., and the last block concludes at 12:00 p.m. We ask that all parents/guardians/family members exit Circle F Dude Ranch Camp by 12:00 p.m. Lunch service begins at 12:00 p.m., and it is important for our campers to connect and engage with their cabinmates and counselors during this time.

Closing Day

Parents/Guardians should have their ID ready upon entry to the Ranch. Once ID is confirmed, you will receive your child's check out packet and a gate pass for departure. Check out packets include any remaining medications, money, or cell phones that were turned into the Camp office at check in.

Closing day is filled with excitement for our campers, as everyone participates in our Camper Rodeo. All campers walk with their cabinmates and counselors to the Rodeo grounds.

The Rodeo begins at **10:00 a.m.** All Camp families are invited to attend this favorite Circle F tradition. Parents/Guardians can arrive at **9:00 a.m.** to gather their camper's luggage and then head to the Rodeo grounds. Benches will be set up under the trees, but you are welcome to bring your own chair. Complimentary cold water will be available.

Campers will not be released until after the Rodeo concludes. Since the Rodeo is a camp wide event, all Circle F staff are involved. If you need to leave before the Rodeo begins, please notify us ahead of time so we can have staff available to assist you.

This event will be your first opportunity to lock in lowest rates and register your camper for the following summer.

Airport Pickup and Drop Off

For campers traveling via air who require transportation to or from the Ranch, we have established a clear airport pickup and drop off policy to ensure a safe and seamless transition. Because airline policies vary, especially for unaccompanied minors, we ask families to carefully review their airline's specific requirements in advance and create a plan. Please discuss the plan with your child so he/she knows what to expect.

Pick Up (Arrival to Camp)

For campers arriving by air and requiring transportation to the Ranch (fees apply, see 2026 Camp Fees in this Handbook for details):

- Circle F staff will meet campers at the airport near baggage claim.
- Staff will be easily identifiable, wearing red Circle F shirts.
- A minimum of two Circle F staff members will be present for all airport pickups.

Drop Off (Departure from Camp)

For campers departing by air and requiring transportation to the airport from the Ranch (fees apply, see 2026 Camp Fees in this Handbook for details):

- Circle F staff will transport campers to the airport and assist with the check in process.
- Minors will be accompanied to their gate by a Circle F staff member.

Campers Registered as Unaccompanied Minors

- Upon arrival, campers traveling as unaccompanied minors will be picked up according to the airline's specific procedures. Circle F staff will follow airline protocols to receive the camper directly from airline personnel.
- Upon departure, campers will be escorted through check in and handed off to airline staff at the designated location.
- Parents/Guardians are responsible for:
 - Understanding and completing all required procedures and documentation.
 - Listing the appropriate Circle F staff member (provided in advance) for pickup.
 - Providing designated pickup contact at the destination airport.
 - Creating a travel plan and discussing it with their child so he/she knows what to expect.
- Circle F staff will assist with this process as needed.

Campers Not Registered as Minors

Circle F staff will assist with check in and accompany campers as far as permitted by airline and airport regulations (typically to the security checkpoint).

Transportation to and from the Ranch will be provided with our camp van. Depending on travel time, campers will receive meals in place of any missed meals. For example, if they have an early flight, they will be provided with breakfast either enroute or at the airport. All passengers in our camp van must wear seat belts for the duration of the trip. We strive to ensure that campers' journeys to and from our Ranch are comfortable, safe, and enjoyable.

Packing List

Please use the list below as a guide and adjust it to suit your child. Plan to send 10 to 12 days' worth of clothing to cover all the activities and weather possibilities. This list is for every camper, regardless of the session they attend. Campers aged 10 years and younger should have a minimum of six extra pairs of socks and underwear. Every item, including the clothing worn to camp, must be marked with your child's name in a permanent way.

Clothing

- 12 shirts
- 10 shorts
- 12 underwear
- 8 bras
- 12 pairs of socks
- 2 sweatshirts or jackets
- 3 jeans/long pants
- 3 pajamas/sleep wear
- 3 swimsuits/swim trunks
- 1 bathrobe (optional)
- 1 raincoat w/hood or poncho
- 1 "nice" outfit for banquet

Camp is a great place for old clothes. We do not recommend sending new or expensive clothes with your camper. Our laundry service does not do fine, delicate, or hand washables. All laundry items go in the washer and dryer.

Footwear

The camp is sandy, and campers get wet and dirty. Every camper needs sneakers that are closed toe and secured at the back, and sandals.

- 2 pairs of sandals/flip flops for walking to waterfront and waterpark excursion.
- 2 pairs of sneakers/closed toe shoes – climbing/sports/riding and theme park excursion.
- 1 pair of shower sandals/flip flops (optional).
- Boots are **recommended** for all campers that participate in horseback riding. Any camper participating in horseback riding **must** wear appropriate footwear, boots, hard soled shoes with a heel, or closed toed shoes that are secured at the back. Crocs, sandals, open toed, and open back shoes are not permitted.

Bedding and Linens

Twin size sheets for beds

- 2 Twin top sheets
- 2 Twin fitted bottom sheets
- 2 light blankets
- 2 pillowcases
- 1 pillow
- 2 beach towels
- 4 bath towels
- 3 hand towels (optional)
- Washcloths/loofah/bath pouf
- 1 bathmat for bedside (helps control sand)

Personal Hygiene Items

Remember to pack enough for the whole session!

- Sunscreen
- Hairbrush/comb
- 2 toothbrushes & case
- Toothpaste
- Tissues
- Shampoo & Conditioner
- Body wash
- Bug repellent
- Deodorant
- Lip balm/Chapstick
- Caddy/bucket to keep everything in
- Nail clippers
- Gold bond stick/powder or similar
- Extra eyeglasses/contacts/solution
- Feminine products

Equipment/Supplies

- Flashlight w/batteries (enough for full session)
- Stationery/postcards (self-addressed & stamped)
- Sunglasses
- Pens
- Address book

Optional

- Box or clip on fan w/extension cord
- 5 short bungee cords to attach fans to beds
- Mattress topper/egg crate
- Card games
- Camera, books, games
- Ear plugs and nose plugs for swimming in the lake

Personal Equipment

Circle F provides the following equipment, but you may bring your own:

- Tennis racket
- Softball glove
- Fishing tackle & pole
- Skateboard w/helmet
- Lifejacket
- Riding Helmet

Laundry

Laundry is collected once a week and returned the same or the next day. Our in-house laundry service washes, dries, and folds each camper's laundry individually. Our laundry service does not do fine, delicate, or hand washables. Circle F provides each camper with a laundry bag.

Personal Property

Circle F Dude Ranch Camp is not responsible for the loss of or damage to personal property, including laundry. **Please do not send anything valuable or irreplaceable.**

Camper Trunk or Foot Locker

Campers store their belongings in their camp trunk or footlocker. Please pack all loose items into a container to make it easier to deliver items to their cabin during check in.

Foot lockers, small trunks, or 122 quart/115 liter Rubbermaid type containers with lids work best. The maximum height should be no more than 16" to fit under the lower bunk. Two campers share the space under the lower bunk bed for their bins. Avoid larger steamer trunks. Campers may bring plastic drawers, however, space for drawers is very limited. Suitcases are also permitted.

Packing Do's and Don'ts

Circle F Dude Ranch Camp is not responsible for camper's personal property. Please label everything in a permanent way with your child's name.

Items that are okay to bring:

- iPod/MP3 Players w/headphones – music, books, podcasts. *Please remove apps, video, TV, and games before coming to camp. **THERE IS NO INTERNET ACCESS FOR CAMPERS. Please see our Music/Book/Podcast Policy below.***
- E-Readers – for books only
- Cameras (disposable or inexpensive)
- Radio/CD Player w/headphones (battery)
- Clocks (battery)
- Games
- Books
- Booklights (battery)
- Stuffed Animals

Items that are not okay:

- Food, Candy, Gum, Drinks
- Firearms, Weapons, Knives
- Incendiary devices (nothing that can start a fire, no lighters, matches, fireworks, etc.)
- **Cell phones, iPads, tablets, smart watches, smart glasses, smart devices,** or anything that can make a call (See Cell Phone/Tablet/Smart Device Policy below).
- Any device that has access to the internet or a mobile data plan
- Walkie Talkies
- Computers, Laptops, DVD Players, or anything that plays tv/movies
- Gameboys/DS/PSS/ETC- any Game System
- Television
- Video Camera
- Large Equipment
- Expensive Jewelry, Cameras
- Large Markers or Spray Paint

SPECIAL NOTE ON ELECTRONICS

The camp environment is not favorable for electronics. Personal electronics brought to camp in the past have been lost, damaged, or rendered unusable. Circle F Dude Ranch Camp is not responsible for lost, damaged, or stolen electronics or equipment.

Cell Phone/Tablet/Smart Device Policy

Your child's experience at Circle F Dude Ranch Camp is designed to foster independence. We also want to keep you as connected as much as we can. The telephone schedule, web/app photos, letters, and access to the Directors are set up with these goals in mind.

Cell phones, tablets, laptops, computers, smart watches, smart glasses, smart devices, and other similar devices are prohibited for campers.

We know that for adults and older children, cell phones and smart devices are the way we live today. At camp, our lives are very different. We are outside and busy all day long. We ask that all campers leave their cell phone, tablet, laptop, computer, smart watch, smart glasses, smart device, and other similar devices with their parent/guardian, so that they can get in touch with nature and experience the true value of summer camp.

A phone on "airplane mode" or without a service plan or a sim card is still a phone and is **NOT** permitted.

Our camp counselors also adhere to this policy and leave their phones in lockers at our camp office. We use radio communication and a P.A. system throughout the Ranch for announcements.

Music/Book/Podcast Policy

Campers may bring an electronic device to listen to music, a book, podcast, or recording for use during quiet time in their cabin at camp. Please bring headphones so as not to disturb other campers. Campers are not permitted to use or carry the device around camp at any other time.

Electronic devices brought to Circle F Dude Ranch Camp may not have Internet or Wi-Fi access, and may only play stored/saved music or content that does not contain or depict any explicit lyrics, illicit, foul, obscene, vulgar, profane, offensive, defamatory, sexual, or other inappropriate language, images, recordings, or content. Any apps, games, movies, and TV recordings must be deleted from the device prior to arrival at camp.

PARENTS/GUARDIANS are responsible for collecting their child's phone, tablet, laptop, computer, smart watch, smart glasses, smart device, or other devices, and checking permissible devices brought to camp for prohibited content prior to leaving for camp.

QUESTIONS? Email or call us. Violation of these policies will result in loss of equipment during the child's camp session, and possible disciplinary action.

Theme Days and Special Events

Campers may choose to dress up for our weekly Theme Days and other special events or evening programs. It is not necessary for you to purchase items for your camper. We suggest packing a t-shirt, costume, hat, or whatever else you can find at home that goes along with the themes. ***We will email a themed packing list to you in advance.***

Sessions 1, 2, and 3

Western Festival: Western Festival is a three-day event where camp is transformed into the Old West. Campers should come prepared with jeans, flannels, hats, and any other western wear!

First Time Campers and Parents/Guardians

We want campers and parents/guardians to feel comfortable and welcome. As you prepare for camp, you might have some questions, so please call or email us anytime. We want to help make this journey as smooth as possible for everyone.

Prior To Camp

Forms

It is imperative that you complete and submit all camp forms with care and on time. Having the forms submitted timely allows us to fully prepare our staff to support your child's needs. This is especially important for first time campers, to help us get to know your child. The more information we have, the better experience we can provide. After we receive your child's forms, we will review everything and call you if we have any questions or need to discuss anything in more detail. Please do not hesitate to call or email us if you have any questions about the paperwork.

During Camp

Phone Calls

We will email you with your child's phone call schedule after Opening Day, so you can keep in touch with your child during camp. We know these calls are important to both of you. **Please make sure we have the correct phone number on file that you want us to call.** It is NORMAL for your child to express feelings about missing you, but that doesn't mean he or she isn't having fun! We are there to support your child after the phone call. We will keep you informed of any feelings your child is having about homesickness.

Photos

Each day, you'll be able to browse camp photos and catch a glimpse of the fun your child is experiencing. While we can't guarantee a photo every day, we make it a priority to have pictures of each camper posted in the Campanian app or your CampInTouch Portal at least once or twice a week—and more often when possible—so you can feel connected and share in their camp adventures.

First few days-Director check in

At Circle F Dude Ranch Camp, we pride ourselves in having hands on Directors and caring staff members. We check on all the campers throughout the day. During the first week of camp, we pay close attention to ensure that everyone is settling in and that they are having a great camp experience. We also remind our campers that we are there for them should the need arise.

Staying Connected

Photos

Our digital media team is dedicated to capturing camp life daily. From activity time to evening programs, our photographers take photos to share with you through the Campanian app or CampInTouch portal. Our goal is to capture approximately 150 photos every day, with a daily upload for our parents/guardians to view. Please be sure to download the Campanian app and upload a photo of your child for face recognition/photo tagging.

Purchasing Photos

1. Log into CampInTouch and select the "Photos" icon.
2. Select an "Album."
3. Browse through the photos and select the photos you wish to purchase or download. Once downloads have been purchased (either in batch or individually), users can re-download all their photo purchases through the "Favorites" folder in their Photo system. This is especially useful if the user wishes to save copies of the photo to an additional device/computer.

CampStamps, Emails, and eLetters

CampStamps

Camp families can purchase CampStamps to send typed letters to their camper, which will be printed and delivered to their cabin. You can add CampStamps to your account by clicking the link at the top of the Email page. CampStamps are deducted from the sender's account for emails sent to a camper. CampInTouch will not refund unused CampStamps, however, they will remain in your account so they can be used during future camp sessions.

Email Enhancements

In the Email center, you can add games and stationery to your email.

- Smart Words: Add age-appropriate vocabulary words (options: elementary, middle, SAT prep.)
- Sudoku: Add a Sudoku game to an email (three levels of difficulty to choose from).
- Stationery: Choose from a variety of fun, digital stationery to further personalize an email.

Send A Smile: Attach a photo to an email. This option is found below the email body text.

eLetters

eLetters offer an easy way for your child to send letters from camp to parents/guardians. Each page of eLetter stationery has a unique, printed barcode.

Providing eLetter Stationery:

Parents/Guardians can give their camper eLetter stationery in two ways:

1. Send an "eLetter stack" with their camper before they leave home. Using this option, parents can print a stack of eLetter stationery (up to 20 pages at a time) within their CampInTouch account. There is no CampStamp cost to print eLetter stationery.
2. Attach an eLetter reply request to an individual camper email. This option is found below the email body and will request a single eLetter reply from the camper. CampStamps will not be deducted for the eLetter until a reply is received by the parent/guardian.

Phone Calls

We want you to be able to stay connected to your child while they are at camp. We will email you with your child's phone call schedule after Opening Day. Our phone call schedule is set up weekly during a specified day and time when parents/guardians may talk to their child. Call times are after lunch, and do not interfere with daily camp activities. However, weather conditions can require us to make last minute changes. We will email you as soon as possible if there are any changes to the telephone schedule.

One of our goals is to help our campers gain independence. The schedule helps campers know when to expect to speak with family, and they look forward to that time. You can call us prior to your designated day to get an update so that you can prepare for the phone call.

You will get to talk for **5 to 7 minutes per child** – a perfect amount to check in and find out about life at camp. A staff member will let the camper know when the time is up.

If the call schedule is not convenient for you, please call or email our Assistant Director of Family Relations, Kris Canchon, at 863-224-7113 or kris@circlefduderanch.com to set up an alternative time. We will inform your child of the change.

International Calls

We use WhatsApp for all international calls. For parents/guardians who reside or will be outside of the United States while your child is at Circle F Dude Ranch Camp, please download WhatsApp prior to your camper's arrival so we can effectively communicate with you and enable your camper to have a smooth phone call experience. If you have any questions, please call our main office at 863-676-4113, or our Assistant Director of Family Relations, Kris Canchon, at 863-224-7113.

Due to the volume of phone calls to be made, they are for parents/guardians only. We cannot accommodate calls with relatives or friends. Please recommend that they send emails or letters to your camper instead.

Packages

Parents/guardians can send packages to their campers while they are at camp. Please keep these important guidelines in mind when sending a package:

- **No food, candy, drinks, or gum.** Please do not send campers any of these items. Any such items will be collected and disposed of at the camp office. Your child's cabinmates may have allergies, and these items can attract unwanted pests or wildlife.
- **No weapons, knives, lighters, matches, fireworks, or incendiary items.** Do not send any of these items to camp. Any such items will be collected and disposed of at the camp office.
- **No inappropriate items/materials.** Do not send any inappropriate items or materials depicting or containing illicit, explicit, vulgar, offensive, obscene, profane, foul, defamatory, sexual, or inappropriate images or content. Any such items will be collected and disposed of at the camp office.
- **Mail on Time:** Remember to allow enough time for your package to arrive at camp before your child's camp session ends. Make sure to clearly label the outside of the package with your camper's first and last name.

- Packages will be opened and inspected before being given to campers.

Incidental medical, prescription, and health care related expenses will be charged to the parent's/guardian's credit card on file, at the time of service. When possible, your insurance and/or pharmacy card provided will be used. Circle F Dude Ranch Camp will provide transportation for your child to and from these sites, within the Lake Wales area. Parents/guardians are responsible for providing or arranging transportation for care or treatment outside of the Lake Wales area.

In some instances, parents/guardians may be eligible for a tax deduction for camp. Please consult with your accounting or tax professional.

Camper Code of Conduct

1. The use or possession of any form of tobacco products, vapes, alcohol, or illegal drugs is prohibited at Circle F Dude Ranch Camp, and during any Camp related trips, excursions, or transport. These items will be confiscated by Camp staff. The camper's parent/guardian will be contacted. Disciplinary action or expulsion from our Camp program may occur.
2. The use, possession, or brandishing of any firearms, weapons, knives, lighters, matches, fireworks, incendiary items or devices, or other potentially dangerous items or devices are prohibited at Circle F Dude Ranch Camp, and during any Camp related trips, excursions, or transport. These items will be confiscated by Camp staff. The camper's parent/guardian will be contacted. Disciplinary action or expulsion from our Camp program may occur.
3. The use or possession of any items or materials containing, displaying, exhibiting, or depicting any inappropriate, explicit, illicit, vulgar, offensive, obscene, profane, foul, defamatory, or sexual language, images, or content is prohibited at Circle F Dude Ranch Camp, and during any Camp related trips, excursions, or transport. These items will be confiscated by Camp staff.
4. Campers will be present at all scheduled activities and will remain in supervised areas at all times. Campers will adhere to all posted or staff provided rules in all activity areas.
5. Campers will not enter a cabin other than the one they are assigned to without the permission of the campers and counselors that are assigned to the cabin they seek to enter. Co-ed visits are strictly prohibited.
6. Leaving cabins after lights out in the evening is prohibited except in the event of an emergency or medical necessity.
7. Campers will respect all other campers, counselors, administrators, and camp staff. Any abusive, violent, obscene, harassing, bullying, offensive, harmful, or otherwise inappropriate or criminal behavior or acts are prohibited at Circle F Dude Ranch Camp, or during any Camp related trips, excursions, or transport. Said behavior or acts may result in disciplinary action or expulsion from our Camp program. Parents/guardians of the involved parties will be contacted.
8. Sexual harassment, contact, conduct, or acts of any kind, or the simulation thereof, is prohibited, and may result in disciplinary action or expulsion from our Camp program. Parents/guardians of the involved parties will be contacted.

9. Campers shall not use abusive, harassing, vulgar, offensive, profane, obscene, foul, defamatory, or otherwise inappropriate language while at Circle F Dude Ranch Camp or during any Camp related trips, excursions, or transport.
10. All items brought to Camp shall be clearly marked or labeled with the camper's name in a permanent way. Circle F Dude Ranch Camp is not responsible for the loss, damage to, or theft of a camper's valuables, equipment, electronics, or property. Any such instance should be reported to a Circle F staff member as soon as possible, and will be investigated. Items of significant or sentimental value that cannot be replaced should not be brought to Camp.
11. Any loss, damage to, or theft of Circle F Dude Ranch Camp's property will be charged to the credit card on file for the family of the camper responsible. The parent/guardian of the involved party will be contacted.
12. All medications—prescription or non-prescription (including aspirin)—must be kept in the Camp's Health Center at all times. The parents/guardians of campers that require rescue medication in the cabin should contact the main office and make the proper arrangements before camper check in.
13. Respect for all living things is expected. Camp animals, wildlife, and the natural environment shall not be harassed, abused, intentionally harmed or damaged, or destroyed.
14. All campers are expected to contribute to keeping the cabins and Camp property clean and maintained. Graffiti, vandalism, damage, or destruction of Circle F Dude Ranch Camp property is prohibited and may result in disciplinary action and expulsion from the Camp program.
15. Campers are prohibited from bringing cell phones, laptops, computers, tablets, smart watches, smart glasses, smart devices, and other similar electronic devices with internet or Wi-Fi access to Camp. Any device not left with the camper's parent/guardian will be kept in the Camp office and returned at the end of the camper's Camp session.

2026 Terms and Conditions

Enrollment of your child in any of Circle F Dude Ranch Camp's 2026 Summer Camp Programs constitutes your acceptance of, and agreement to abide by, all Terms and Conditions outlined herein.

Deposit

Upon enrollment in any 2026 Summer Camp session, a non-refundable deposit of \$750.00 per child, per session is required to reserve a spot for your child.

Payment Deadlines

The remaining balance owed must be paid in full, as outlined:

Second Payment: February 1, 2026

- Three Week Session – \$1,500.00
- Two Week Session – \$1,000.00
- One Week Session – \$500.00

Pay-in-Full Date: May 1, 2026

Payment Options

Camp families may pay tuition by:

- **Cash**
- **Check** – Must arrive at least 21 days before your camper's session starts.
- **E-Check** – 1% convenience fee will be added
- **Credit Card** – 3% convenience fee will be added
- **Wire Transfer** – \$35 fee will be added

Transfer of Paid Funds

Circle F Dude Ranch Camp permits the transfer of paid funds between campers within the same household, under the following conditions:

- *Before May 1, 2026:* All funds paid, excluding the \$750 non-refundable deposit, may be transferred to another camper in the same household.
- *After May 1, 2026:* Up to 50% of unused funds may be transferred to another camper in the same household.

Refunds

Circle F Dude Ranch Camp offers refunds before 2026 Summer Camp begins, under these conditions:

- Before **May 1, 2026**: All funds paid, minus the \$750 non-refundable deposit, may be refunded.
- After **May 1, 2026**: All funds paid are non-refundable.

Once Camp Begins:

- No refunds will be issued for late arrival, early departure, absence, homesickness, suspension, expulsion, withdrawal, or circumstances beyond our control (acts of God, war, etc.).
- In the event of camper illness, prorated credits toward a future session or program will be provided.

Cancellation

By Camper Family:

- Cancelled enrollments are bound by the Terms and Conditions outlined herein for refunds.

By Circle F Dude Ranch Camp:

- Circle F Dude Ranch Camp, at its sole discretion, can cancel any Camp session.
- If Circle F Dude Ranch Camp cancels any Camp session, and cannot transfer your camper to another session, a full refund, including the deposit, will be issued.
- Circle F Dude Ranch Camp can cancel any camper's enrollment at its sole discretion.
- If Circle F Dude Ranch Camp cancels a camper's enrollment, and the camper has not been suspended or expelled pursuant to the Terms and Conditions outlined herein, a full refund, including the deposit, will be issued.

Suspension or Expulsion from Camp

Circle F Dude Ranch Camp, at its sole discretion, may suspend or expel any camper and prohibit them from completing their camp session(s) **without refund** for the following reasons:

- Commitment of a crime, as established by state and federal laws.
- Abusive, violent, obscene, harassing, bullying, offensive, or otherwise inappropriate conduct or behavior.
- Possession, brandishing, or use of weapons.
- Possession or use of prohibited substances, including, but not limited to tobacco products, drugs, alcohol, or vapes.
- Falsification or nondisclosure of medical information as required in these Terms and Conditions.
- Abusive, violent, obscene, harassing, bullying, offensive, or otherwise inappropriate conduct or behavior; and/or criminal conduct by a camper's parent/guardian—or anyone acting on their behalf—towards Camp staff or other campers.
- Any behavior or situation deemed by Circle F Dude Ranch Camp to fall short of Camp standards or that creates a negative atmosphere or environment.

Program Tuition

All Circle F Dude Ranch Camp program tuition includes:

- Classic Camp Activities
- Reusable Water Bottle
- Laundry Bag
- Lodging, Meals, and Daily Snacks/Drinks*

Summer Camp Programs include:

- Circle F Dude Ranch Camp shirt, one per session
- Year Award, one per summer
- Laundry Service: Campers are provided with wash/dry/fold service at least once per week.
- Typhoon Lagoon Waterpark Trip (Only in Session 1, 2, 3, 2AB, 3BC)

Additional Cost Add-Ons:

Our summer camp programs offer the following additional cost add-ons that are not included in camper tuition:

- Paintball: *Open to campers aged 10 and up, based on their age on the first day of Camp.*
- Theme Park Excursion (Only in Session 1, 2, 3, 2BC, 3BC)

*If your camper participates in the Summer Camp theme park excursions (Disney's Magic Kingdom, Universal Islands of Adventure, Universal Studios, Typhoon Lagoon), they will receive meal vouchers with drinks for all meals while at the theme parks. Circle F Dude Ranch Camp does not provide additional snacks or drinks on theme park days as they are readily available around the park for camper purchase.

Camper Medical

We recommend downloading the **Campanion App** on your mobile device or utilizing the CampInTouch Parent Portal to complete and upload required documents. To participate in Circle F Dude Ranch Camp programs, the following medical requirements must be met:

- All campers must undergo a physical examination by a licensed healthcare provider within 12 months of the start of their Camp program.
- A licensed healthcare provider must complete the **Camper Physical Exam Form**.
- The **Camper Physical Exam Form and Parent Medical Authorization Form** must be uploaded into the Campanion App or the CampInTouch Parent Portal at least 14 days prior to the start of the camper's session.
- Documentation of the camper's up-to-date immunizations and pharmacology must also be uploaded to the Campanion App or CampInTouch Parent Portal at least 14 days prior to the start of the camper's session.

- Parents/Guardians must grant Camp Medical Staff permission to communicate with the camper's healthcare and behavioral providers as needed.
- To ensure camper and staff safety, **prior to enrollment and payment of the non-refundable deposit**, Parent(s)/Guardian(s) must disclose to the Camp Director any of the camper's learning disabilities, physical disabilities, therapies, medical conditions, behavioral conditions, and mental/emotional conditions. This information allows us to determine if we can appropriately support your child. For example, habitual bedwetters cannot be accepted.
- Failure to disclose this information as required, if discovered after arrival or during the Camp session, may result in suspension or expulsion of the camper. **No refunds will be provided.**

Electronic Devices/Personal Items

- Electronic devices brought to Circle F Dude Ranch Camp may not have Internet or Wi-Fi access and may only play stored/saved music or content that does not contain or depict any foul, obscene, offensive, defamatory, derogatory, or other inappropriate language or images.
- Phones, computers, laptops, tablets, smart watches, smart glasses, smart devices, and other similar devices with text or call features, and the like are not permitted.
- Books, magazines, pamphlets, and any other items or materials that contain or depict any foul, obscene, offensive, defamatory, derogatory, or other inappropriate language or images are not permitted, and will be confiscated. Parent(s)/Guardian(s) will be contacted.
- If a camper is found to have any prohibited devices, materials, or items described above, they will be confiscated, and Parent(s)/Guardian(s) will be contacted.
- Circle F Dude Ranch Camp is not responsible for the loss of or damage to a camper's personal items, equipment, or electronics.
