Necessary	
	4 single sheets (2 flat, 2 fitted)
	1 pillow
	2 pillowcases
	2 wool or fleece blankets
	2 bath towels
	personal hygiene products (soap, shampoo, deodorant, etc)
	2 toothbrushes and 2 toothpastes (1 large tube for in camp, 1 small travel size for trips)
	1 laundry bag with your name on it (tip: use this bag to pack for camp)
	8 pair socks + 2 pair wool socks
	8 underpants + 1 quick-drying underpants (i.e., not cotton)
	1 lightweight synthetic long underwear top and bottom
	1 pajama
	2 shorts
	1 swim trunks
	2 long pants + 1 quick-drying pants (i.e., not cotton)
	8 t-shirts + 1 quick-drying t-shirt (i.e., not cotton)
	2 warm long-sleeve shirts + 1 quick-drying long-sleeve shirt (i.e., not cotton)
	1 lightweight wind jacket that dries quickly and repels water
	2 light fleece jackets
	1 quality rain jacket (preferably with mesh lining)
	1 pair sandals and/or Crocs
	1 pair athletic shoes (for sports at camp)
	1 pair hiking shoes (to get wet on trips- no open-toed or water shoes)
	1 billed hat and/or 1 synthetic sun hat with neck strap
	1 thin stocking hat
	1 20- to 35-liter roll-top dry bag/sack (Sea to Summit or other popular brand)
	1 synthetic sleeping bag (rated 40°f, stuffs to the size of a basketball)
	1 LED headlamp
	1 sunglasses with neck strap (we lose a lot of glasses in the lake)
	1 one-liter Nalgene water bottle
	1 mosquito head net + 2 small bottles (~12 oz) insect repellent
	1 plastic cup, plastic bowl, and plastic spoon stored in nylon mesh bag
