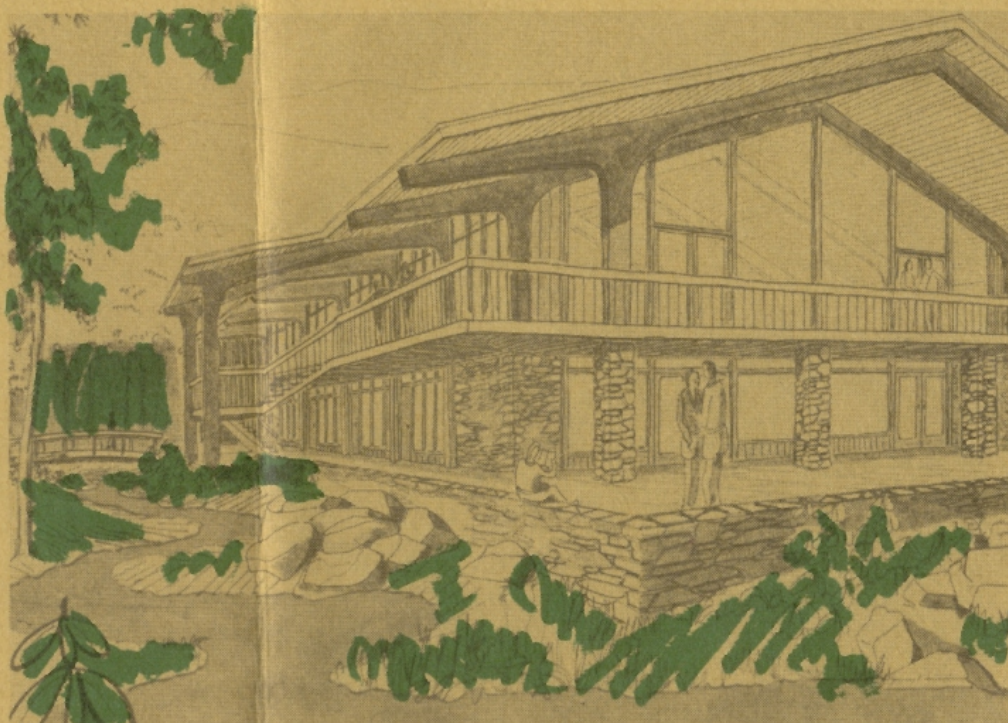

## *Adventure in the Woods*

A special woodcraft area is set apart for teaching and practicing the skills which make a boy adept and at home in the woods. At Falling Creek a boy has an unequalled opportunity to learn to love and appreciate the out of doors. The camp is located on 500 acres of undisturbed woodland and there is an abundance of wildlife and wilderness camping at hand.

Boys who are active in the scout program will have an excellent opportunity to pass merit badges under scout officials of long experience.

A program of trail riding is offered. Old riding trails make beautiful bridle paths for brisk canters and relaxing rides in the filtered sunlight.



## *Adventure in Sports*

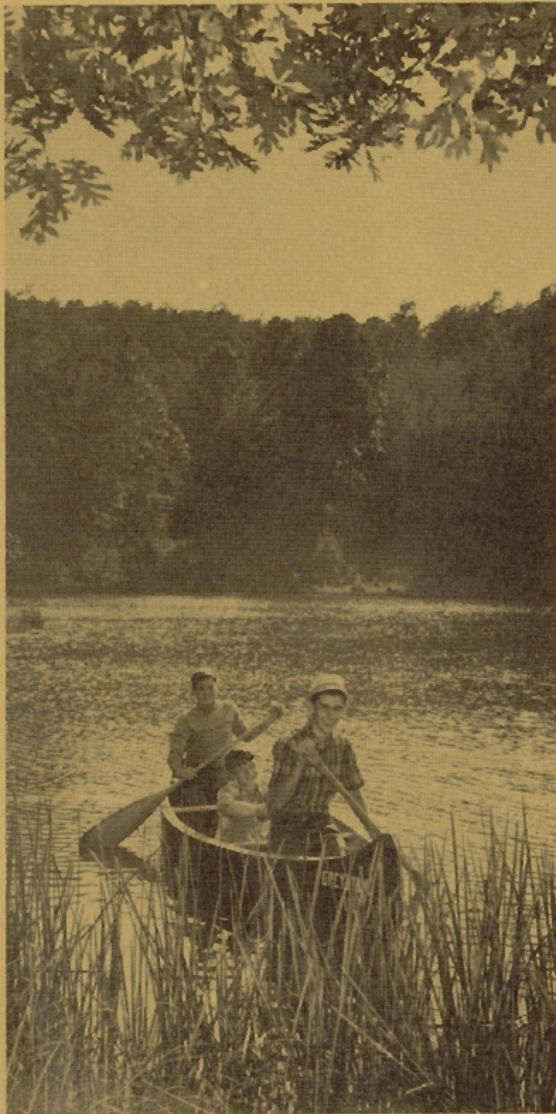
